

INTRODUCTION & METHODOLOGY

From August 6-11, 2022, DHM Research conducted a survey of Oregonians. The purpose of the survey was to check in with Oregonians about the major issues in the upcoming election, including abortion.

Research Methodology: The online survey consisted of 500 Oregon residents ages 18+ who are registered to vote and plan to vote in the November election. The sample was modeled to match the demographic profile of likely voters. This is a sufficient sample size to assess Oregonians' opinions generally and to review findings by multiple subgroups.

Respondents were contacted by using a professionally maintained online panel. A variety of quality control measures were employed, including questionnaire pre-testing and data validation. To ensure a representative sample, demographic quotas were set, and data were weighted by area of state, age, gender, race, education, and political party affiliation.

Statement of Limitations: Any sampling of opinions or attitudes is subject to a margin of error. The margin of error is a standard statistical calculation that represents differences between the sample and total population at a confidence interval, or probability, calculated to be 95%. This means that there is a 95% probability that the sample taken for this study would fall within the stated margin of error if compared with the results achieved from surveying the entire population. The margin of error for this survey is $\pm 4.4\%$.
