

# Public Order Post Event Debrief Summary

Date and time: 10/20/2025

Location: 4310 S. Macadam

IC: Cpt. David Jackson

## Narrative of event:

I assumed Command of the IMT at 15:00hrs. Vehicles were going in/out of the facility without any issues. The crowd size remained around 50 individuals spread around the area throughout the evening with low energy. Of those 50 individuals, at most 15 were in front of or near the ICE facility. At approximately 21:00hrs a flag was burned; the fire quickly went out and no damage was caused.

Federal officers were observed coming out several times. There appeared to be no resistance from the crowd as the vehicles entered/exited the facility. One arrest was observed this evening by federal officers around 21:40hrs, it is unknown why the subject was taken into custody. Shortly after the arrest, Federal officers deployed pepper balls for unknown reasons at several people as they ran away. This arrest and deployment of pepper balls temporarily increased the energy of the crowd.

The RRT bike team provided a consistent presence around the location. DLOs also remained in the area and would engage the crowd when appropriate.

## Significant Decision Points:

22:10hrs – Crowd had diminished in size and returned to low energy; responsibility transitioned to CE Precinct for the remainder of the evening (Sgt. Shiferaw briefed).

## Significant Issues and Problems:

21:45hrs – Sgt. Kofed notified us that Federal officers had shot pepper balls in his direction for unknown reasons from the top of the ICE facility. This occurred shortly after Federal officers took someone into custody for unknown reasons and members of the crowd ran away. Shortly after, several Federal officers exited the facility and interacted with Sgt. Kofed at S. Bancroft and S. Moody where he had been staged. They told him something to the effect of “help or get out of our way”. They informed Sgt. Kofed that individuals had been shining flashlights at the Federal officers and had run off behind the RRT bikes. Federal officers then returned to the ICE facility and communicated with Lt. Stensgaard via a phone call a similar message of “help us or get out of our way”. We confirmed with Sgt. Kofed that no PPB officers were struck by an pepper ball rounds fired by Federal officers.
